Groundwork improve footpaths around Broughton

Groundwork has improved the footpaths around Broughton, Wrexham in partnership with Wrexham County Borough Council. Now walkers can enjoy the new footpaths which have benefitted from new kissing gates, way marking, surfacing and footpath furniture, making them more accessible for everyone. Over 13.5 km of footpaths have been improved as part of this project.

Local Landowner in Broughton, Mr Keith Steven from Bryn Malley Farm said, ' I have been really pleased to work with Wrexham Council and Groundwork to improve the footpaths by installing kissing gates on my land, this has really improved the accessibility of the local countryside'.
